Village of Thornloe (Free Provincial Water Testing)

Whereas the Ontario Auditor General's annual report on public health from December 2023 indicates that Public Health Ontario is proposing the phasing-out of free provincial water testing services for private drinking water; and

Whereas free private drinking water testing services has played a pivotal role in safeguarding public health, particularly in rural communities: and

Whereas the removal of free private drinking water testing could lead to a reduction in testing, potentially increasing the risk of waterborne diseases in these vulnerable populations; and

Whereas the tragic events in Walkerton, Ontario underscored the critical importance of safe drinking water.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Temiskaming Municipal Association hereby requests the Province reconsider and ultimately decide against the proposed phasing-out of free private drinking water testing services.

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED that this resolution be sent to Minister of Environment Conservation and Parks, Minister of Health and John Vanthof, MPP Temiskming-Cochrane.

WHEREAS the Public Sector Accounting Board (PSAB) establishes accounting standards for the public sector which must be followed by all Ontario municipalities;

AND WHEREAS the Municipal Act, 2001 section 294.1 states that a municipality shall, for each fiscal year, prepare annual financial statements for the municipality in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles for local governments as recommended, from time to time, by the Public Sector Accounting Board of the Chartered Professional Accountants of Canada;

AND WHEREAS PS 3280 is a new accounting standard covering asset retirement obligations (ARO) that was approved by PSAB in March 2018;

AND WHEREAS the standard must be applied by all public sector entities who prepare their financial statements under PSAB, including all Canadian municipalities;

AND WHEREAS many small municipalities do not have accountants or engineers on staff to complete the ARO obligations and this major accounting change will force small municipalities to hire consultants to complete this work and cause a significant financial burden to municipalities;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Temiskaming Municipal Association hereby calls upon the province of Ontario to provide financial assistance to municipalities to complete the ARO;

AND FINALLY THAT a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Honourable Paul Calandra, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing, the Association of Municipal Clerks and Treasurers of Ontario (AMCTO) and the Federation of Ontario Municipalities (FONOM).





RE: Motion – Public Private Partnership Senior Government Policy Changes (Supporting Northern College's Request)

At its meeting of February 20, 2024, the Council for the Corporation of the Town of Kirkland Lake resolved the following:

"Moved by: Mayor Stacy Wight Seconded by: Councillor Rick Owen

WHEREAS there is a growing concern over the inadequate funding of postsecondary education by the Ontario Government, which has placed additional financial pressures on publicly funded colleges, undermined their sustainability and made it more difficult for colleges to respond to the needs of local employers;

AND WHEREAS Northern College has developed an important public-private college partnership with PURES College that contributes \$30 million annually in revenue to Northern College, equal to one-third of the Northern College Budget;

AND WHEREAS students enrolled in programs offered through the PURES public-private partnership campuses are recognized as students of a publicly funded college and are held to the same high standards of academic rigor, are provided with comparable wrap-around support services to those offered at Northern College and receive a Northern College credential;

AND WHEREAS the elimination of Post-Graduate Work Permits by the Federal Government for students graduating from programs offered through the PURES public-private partnership campus would result in an immediate suspension of revenue to Northern College, adversely affect the sustainability of the college and undermining the ability to support local employers;

AND WHEREAS the Ontario Government has recently called together a group of experts who have released recommendations in the Blue-Ribbon Panel report that are designed to ensure the long-term sustainability of the postsecondary education sector in Ontario:

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Council for The Corporation of the Town of Kirkland Lake urge the Ontario Government to immediately implement the Blue-Ribbon Panel recommendations and actively work with the Federal Government to restore the eligibility of public-private partner colleges, to grant students who successfully complete their program of study, a Post-Graduate Work Permit;

AND FINALLY THAT a copy of this resolution be sent to the Honourable Premier of Ontario, the Member of Provincial Parliament for Timiskaming-Cochrane, the Federation of Northern Ontario Municipalities (FONOM), and all municipalities within the District of Timiskaming.

Dear Honourable Minister,

Re: Shortage of Physician Care and Access to Physician Care

The Township of Evanturel is a rural municipality in the District of Temiskaming where its residents receive hospital care and emergency services in the catchment area of Blanche River Health – at the Englehart Site and the Kirkland Lake Site; and family physician care from the Englehart Family Health Team.

The shortage of physicians in this area leaves a majority of residents without a family doctor; and the emergency department of the Englehart Site has had to close, at times, as no doctor is available to staff same. The only other hospital in the District, Temiskaming Hospital in Temiskaming Shores, serves the catchment area south of our community.

The Council of the Corporation of the Township of Evanturel urges the Province of Ontario to recognize the physician shortage in the District of Temiskaming, and all of Ontario, to fund health care appropriately; and to ensure every Ontarian has access to physician care.

AND WHEREAS a robust workforce developed through a provincial, sector-wide health human resources strategy would significantly improve access to health services across the province;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Evanturel urge the Province of Ontario to recognize the physician shortage in the District of Temiskaming and Ontario, to fund health care appropriately and ensure every Ontarian has access to physician care.

WHEREAS Ontario has more private non-native ("exotic") wild animal keepers, roadside zoos, mobile zoos, wildlife exhibits and other captive wildlife operations than any other province;

AND WHEREAS the Province of Ontario has of yet not developed regulations to prohibit or restrict animal possession, breeding, or use of exotic wild animals in captivity;

AND WHEREAS exotic wild animals can pose very serious human health and safety risks, and attacks causing human injury and death have occurred in the Province:

AND WHEREAS the keeping of exotic wild animals can cause poor animal welfare and suffering, and poses risks to local environments and wildlife;

AND WHEREAS owners of exotic wild animals can move from one community to another even after their operations have been shut down due to animal welfare or public health and safety concerns;

AND WHEREAS municipalities have struggled, often for months or years, to deal with exotic wild animal issues and have experienced substantive regulatory, administrative, enforcement and financial challenges;

AND WHEREAS the Association of Municipalities of Ontario (AMO), the Association of Municipal Managers, Clerks and Treasurers of Ontario (AMCTO), and the Municipal Law Enforcement Officers' Association (MLEOA) have indicated their support for World Animal Protection's campaign for provincial regulations of exotic wild animals and roadside zoos in letters to the Ontario Solicitor General and Ontario Minister for Natural Resources and Forestry;



AND WHEREAS PS 3280 is a new accounting standard covering asset retirement obligations (ARO) that was approved by PSAB in March 2018;

AND WHEREAS the standard must be applied by all public sector entities who prepare their financial statements under PSAB, including all Canadian municipalities;

AND WHEREAS many small municipalities do not have accountants or engineers on staff to complete the ARO obligations and this major accounting change will force small municipalities to hire consultants to complete this work and cause a significant financial burden to municipalities;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT The Corporation of the Township of Coleman hereby calls upon the province of Ontario to provide financial assistance to municipalities to complete the ARO;

Re: Request for Council Resolution: Support a Set-Aside for Northern Ontario within the OINP

On July 25th, 2024, over 40 organizations from across Northern Ontario came together to formally support an initiative to increase provincially led immigration to Northern Ontario communities. Northern Ontario Chambers of Commerce, Municipalities, Economic Development Agencies, Community Futures Development Corporations, Local Immigration Partnerships, Reseau du Nord, and more are working together to advocate for a Northern Ontario "set-aside" within the Ontario Immigrant Nominee Program (OINP).

As the Government of Ontario has full authority to set the parameters and allocations for the OINP. We are requesting 3,000 nominations, annually, be specifically set aside for immigrants coming to Northern Ontario to fill labour shortages. These 3,000 immigrants would help our communities maintain their current standard of living. Meaning there would be enough people to support vital services in our communities, pay taxes, and keep businesses open.

Currently, Northern Ontario is only receiving between 1-3% of all allocations through the OINP (approximately 100-200 nominees per year for the past 14 years). Meanwhile, the GTA receives approximately 90% of ALL immigration to Ontario. OINP has 21,500 total spots to allocate in 2024, up from 9,000 spots just three years ago. That means there is plenty of room to make a set-aside for Northern Ontario work without detracting from the GTA and other Ontario communities.

We need your help ASAP. To put pressure on the provincial government, we are requesting your Council pass a resolution formally supporting a 3,000-nomination set-aside within the OINP for Northern Ontario communities.

The allocation of these 3,000 spots would be spread among communities, ensuring that the benefits of immigration are extended beyond the largest cities in Northern Ontario. Importantly, the set-aside would **work alongside existing programs**, like the federal Rural and Northern Immigration Pilot (and future iterations of it). Also, in-need occupations would be identified specifically for Northern Ontario communities to help address our unique labour shortages.

The federal Rural and Northern Immigration Pilot has brought over 4,000 immigrants to Northern Ontario since its inception five years ago. Targeted, community-level immigration works for Northern Ontario. Help us keep the momentum going.



April 1 to June 30, 2024






