WHEREAS the Federal Government has announced policy changes that will negatively impact publicly funded colleges, such as Northern College and other colleges in small, northern, and rural regions of

Ontario, by altering the framework through which international students are admitted and managed;

AND WHEREAS, these policy changes have been made without any consultation with post-secondary institutions; and without a clear understanding of the severe financial hardship this will cause to smaller public colleges;

**NOW THEREFORE**, the Council of the Corporation of the Township of McGarry resolves to support the Corporation of the Town of Kirkland Lake in its resolution urging the Federal Government to reconsider these policy changes;

Health Care

WHEREAS the state of Health care in Ontario is in crisis, with 2.3 million Ontarians lacking access to a family doctor, emergency room closures across the province, patients being de-rostered and 40% of family doctors considering retirement over the next five years;

AND WHEREAS Ontario municipal government play an integral role in the health care system through responsibilities in public health, long-term care, paramedicine, and other investments;

AND WHEREAS the percentage of family physician's practicians practicing comprehensive family medicine has declines from 77 in 2008 to 65 percent in 2022;

AND WHEREAS per capita health-care spending in Ontario is the lowest of all provinces in Canada;

AND WHEREAS a robust workforce developed through a provincial, sector-wide health human resources strategy would significantly improve access to health services across the province;

**NOW THEREFORE BE RESOLVED THAT** the Council of the Corporation of the Township of McGarry urge the Province of Ontario to recognize the physician shortage in the District of Temiskaming and Ontario, to fund health care appropriately and ensure every Ontarian has access to physician care.

WHEREAS, municipal public works department from across the province of Ontario provide services to their residents to ensure the health and safety of their communities; and will experience skilled labour shortages, over the next few years, to meet these responsibilities;

AND WHEREAS, the association of Ontario Road Supervisors is working to develop a Municipal equipment Operator Course to address this issue;

**NOW THEREFORE**, the Council of the Corporation of the Township of McGarry supports the Corporation of the Town of Kirkland Lake in its call to the Ministry of labour, Training, Immigration and Skilled Trades to fully fund the Municipal Equipment Operator Course in 2024;

**AND FURTHER**. that a copy of this resolution be directed to the Honourable Minister of Labour, Training, Immigration and Skilled Trades, and forwarded to John Vantof – MPP Timiskaming-Cochrane, the Federation of Northern Ontario Municipalities (FONOM), the Temiskaming Municipal Association (TMA), the association of Ontario Road Supervisors (AORS), and the municipalities in the District of Temiskaming.

WHEREAS Ontario has more private non-native ('exotic") wild animal keepers, roadside zoos, mobile zoos, wildlife exhibits and other captive wildlife operations than any other province;

**AND WHEREAS** the Province of Ontario has of yet not developed regulations to prohibit or restrict animal possession, breeding, or use of exotic wild animals in captivity;

AND WHEREAS exotic wild animals can pose very serious human health and safety risks, and attacks causing human injury and death have occurred in the Province;

AND WHEREAS the keeping of exotic wild animals can cause poor animal welfare and suffering, and poses risk to local environments and wildlife;

AND WHEREAS owners of exotic wild animals can move from one community to another even after their operations have been shut down due to animal welfare or public health and safety concerns;

AND WHEREAS municipalities have struggled, often for months or years, to deal with exotic wild animal issues and have experienced substantive regulatory, administrative, enforcement and financial challenges;

AND WHEREAS the Association of Municipalities of Ontario (AMO), the Association of Municipal Managers, Clerks and Treasurers of Ontario (AMCTO), and the Municipal Law Enforcement Officers' Association (MLEOA) have indicated their support for World Animal Protection's campaign for provincial regulations of exotic wild animals and roadside zoos in letter to the Ontario Solicitor General and Ontario Minister for Natural Resources and Forestry;

THEREFORE BE RESOLVED THAT the Corporation of the Township of McGarry hereby petitions the provincial government to implement provincial regulations to restrict the possession, breeding, and use of exotic wild animals and license zoos in order to guarantee the fair and consistent application of policy throughout Ontario for the safety of Ontario's citizen and the exotic wild animal population;

AND FINALLY THAT, a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Premier of Ontario, Ontario's Solicitor General, Ontario's Minister for Natural Resources and Forestry, MPP Timiskaming-Cochrane, AMO, AMCTO, MLEAO, Timiskaming Municipal Association (TMA), the Federation of Northern Ontario Municipalities (FONOM), and all municipalities within the District of Timiskaming.

WHEREAS the Public Sector Accounting Board (PSAB) establishes accounting standards for the Public Sector which must be followed by all Ontario municipalities;

AND WHEREAS the Municipal Act, 2001 section 294.1 states that a municipality shall, for each fiscal year, prepare annual financial statements for the municipality in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles for local governments as recommended, from time to time, by the Public Sector Accounting Board of the Chartered Professional Accountants of Canada;

AND WHEREAS PS 3280 is a new accounting standard covering asset retirement obligations (ARO) that was approved by PSAB in March 2018;

AND WHEREAS the standard must be applied by all public sector entities who prepare their financial statements under PSAB, including all Canadian municipalities;

AND WHEREAS many small municipalities do not have accountants or engineers on staff to complete the ARO obligations and this major accounting change will force small municipalities to hire consultant to complete this work and cause a significant financial burden to municipalities;

**NOW THEREFORE BE RESOLVED THAT** the Corporation of the Township of McGarry hereby calls upon the province of Ontario to provide financial assistance to municipalities to complete the ARO;

AND FINALLY, THAT a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Honourable Paul Calandra, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing, the Association of Municipal Clerks and Treasurers of Ontario (AMCTO), the Timiskaming Municipal Association (TMA), the Federation of the Ontario Municipalities (FONOM), and all municipalities within the District of Timiskaming.

273/2024 Water Testing

WHEREAS the Ontario Auditor General's annual report on public health from December 2023 indicates that Public Health Ontario is proposing the phasing-out of free provincial water testing services for private drinking water; and

WHEREAS free private drinking water testing services has played a pivotal role in safeguarding public health, particularly in rural communities, that rely predominantly on private drinking water; And;

WHEREAS the removal of free private drinking water testing could lead to a reduction in testing, potentially increasing the risk of waterborne diseases in these vulnerable populations; And

WHEREAS the tragic events in Walkerton, Ontario underscored the critical importance of safe drinking water.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that he Township of McGarry hereby request that the province

reconsider and ultimately decide against the proposed phasing-out of free private drinking water testing services.

**FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED** that this resolution be sent to all Ontario municipalities, Minister of Environment Conservation and Parks, Minister of Health, Timiskaming Public Health Unit, and Timiskaming-Cochrane MPP.

WHEREAS employers across Northern Ontario are experiencing a critical shortage of skilled workers, contributing to a shrinking labour market with an estimated 50,000 newcomers needed by 2041 to sustain current Northern Ontario population levels; and

WHEREAS the labour shortage is causing significant economic hardship for Northern Ontario communities, including reduced productivity and business closures; and

WHEREAS population and migration trends to 2021 suggest that Northern Ontario needs 100,000 newcomers by 2041 to sustain current population; and

WHEREAS the success of the federal Rural and Northern Immigration Pilot (RNIP) demonstrates the effectiveness of allocating nomination spots to address regional labour shortages in attracting newcomers to Northern Ontario; and

WHEREAS the Ontario Immigrant Nominee Program has been expanded from 9,750 nominees in 2022 to a goal of 21,500 nominees in 2024;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE COUNCIL OF THE COPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MCGARRY urges the Government of Ontario to address the critical market shortage of skilled labour in Northern Ontario by allocating 3,000 Ontario Immigrant Nominee Program spots to support the region's economic growth and development.
