WHEREAS the Township of McGarry is a community that is home to various resource-based community partners which include mining and forestry; and

WHEREAS the Township of McGarry, as a resource-based community, faces many challenges resulting from having such resource-based industries located and operating within and in proximity of the Township such as localized heavy truck traffic which increases demands on local road infrastructure, traffic congestion, and delays, and general safety concerns for pedestrians and other forms of active transportation users; and

WHEREAS the demands caused by these resource-based industries have created additional costs for the Township of McGarry to maintain the local infrastructure required to service these industries adequately; and

WHEREAS the current assessment-based taxation system does not provide significant funding to the Municipality to meet these demands and needs; and

WHEREAS the Province of Ontario has adopted a critical minerals strategy to position Ontario as a global leader in responsibility sourced critical minerals which aims to see more resources extraction and processing in the North; and

WHEREAS the future housing demand on the Township of Mcgarry as mining is further developed in Northern Ontario will expand the current infrastructure funding gap locally as new housing and development-related infrastructure is required to support and facilitate future mining operation; and

WHEREAS the Township of McGarry acknowledges that it is a recipient of the Northern Ontario Resources Development Support (NORDS) Fund but maintains that the amount received is inadequate to support the demands on local infrastructure caused by the resources-based industries in the area nor is it proportionate to the revenues being for the province by said industries;

THEREFORE IT BE RESOLVED Council of the Corporation of the Township of McGarry hereby petitions the Province of Ontario to create a Provincial funding model, in addition to the NORDS fund which is set to expire in 2026-2027, to provide revenues to all resource-based communities in Northern Ontario that are proportionate to the revenues leaving our region in an effort to offset the additional burdens placed on resource-based communities to provide municipal services to these industries; and

FINALLY THAT a copy of this motion be circulated to the Premier of Ontario, Minister of Municipal affairs and Housing, Minister of Northern Development, Timiskaming-Cochrane MPP, Minister of Mines, Association of Municipalities (AMO), Federation of Northern Ontario Municipalities (FONOM), North (Western) Ontario Municipal Association (NOMA), all district of Timiskaming municipalities, City of Timmins, Municipality of Red Lake, and Township of Dubreuilville.

WHEREAS, elections rules need to be clear, supporting candidates and votes in their electoral participation and election administrators in running elections;

WHEREAS, legislation needs to strike the right balance between providing clear rules and frameworks to ensure the integrity of the electoral process;

WHEREAS, the legislation must also reduce administrative and operational burden for municipal staff ensuring that local election administrator can run elections in a way that responds to the unique circumstances of their local communities;

WHEREAS, the Municipal Elections Act, 1996 (MEA) will be 30 years old by next municipal and school board elections in 2026;

WHEREAS, the MEA sets out the rules for local elections, the Assessment Act, 1990 and and the Education Act, 1990 also contain provisions impacting local elections adding more places for voters, candidates, and administrators to look for the rules that bind the local democratic process in Ontario;

WHEREAS, with rules across three pieces of legislation, and the MEA containing a patchwork of clauses, there are interpretation challenges, inconsistencies, and gaps to fill.

WHEREAS the Act can pose difficulties for voters, candidates, contributors and third-party advertisers to read, to interpret, to comply with and for election administration to enforce,

WHEREAS, while local elections are run as efficiently and effectively as can be within the current legislative framework, modernization and continuous improvement is needed to ensure the Act is responsive to today's needs and tomorrow's challenges;

WHEREAS, to keep public trust and improve safeguard the Act should be reviewed considering the ever-changing landscape which impacts elections administration including privacy, the threats of foreign interference, increased spread of mis/disinformation and the increased use of technologies like artificial intelligence and use of digital identities;

WHEREAS, the Association of Municipal Managers, Clerks, ad treasurer of Ontario (AMCTO) reviewed the Act and has provided several recommendations including modernizing the legislation, harmonizing rules, and streamlining and simplifying administration;

WHEREAS, AMCTO, put forward recommendations for amendments ahead of the 2026 elections and longer-term recommendations for amendments ahead of the 2030 elections;

BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Township of McGarry calls for the Province to update the MEA with priority amendments as outlined by AMCTO before Summer 2025 and ahead of the 2030 elections; and be it further

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution will be forwarded to all municipalities in Ontario for support and that each endorsement be then forwarded to the Minister of Municipal affairs and Housing (ministermah@ontario.ca), the Minister of Education(minister.edu@ontario.ca), the Minister of Public and Business Service Delivery (todd.mccarthy@ontario.ca), Minister of Finance (minister.fin@ontario.ca), the Premier of Ontario (premier@ontario.ca), Sylivia Jones MPP (sylvia.jones@ontario.ca) and AMCTO (advocacy@amcto.com).
